Fig. 33 shows the interior of our honey stand. We used dry-transfer lettering around the coin slot and hand-painted the two red arrows to make it more visible. We protected the “signage” with a couple of coats of clear Varathane. Another sign on the wall invites our customers to serve themselves.

The shelves and risers are not fixed in place and can be set up in different configurations. We also display cookbooks (full of honey recipes of course) and other crafts. The open shelf and deck below can be used for vegetables, perennials or anything else you might have for sale. Personalize your self-serve stand and reap the harvest without having to be there to “mind the store”. Enjoy.
